# **Overview of Moving On Initiative**

#### • Concept

- Providing Section 8 vouchers to tenants interested & ready to move out of supportive housing
- Freeing up SH units for chronically homeless individuals

#### Dates

- 2/07 - 2/09

#### • Parameters

- Open to all DHS funded supportive housing providers
- Must be voluntary for tenants
- \$2,000 per placement/backfill

# Overview of Moving On Initiative (cont.)

#### • Process

- Providers recruit & select tenants
- DHS does initial screening followed by NYCHA interview
- Providers assist tenants in getting voucher, housing, linkages to new community & HRA one-shot

#### • Tenant Criteria

- Must demonstrate ability to pay rent & live independently
- Lived in SH > 1 year at time of application
- No history of disruptive behavior or rent arrears for one year prior
- Must meet NYCHA Section 8 eligibility criteria

# **Participants**

- 57 eligible providers
  - 36 participated (63%)\*
- 115 eligible buildings
  - 56 participated (49%)

## Participating Building Statistics

- Median: 10
- Mean: 20
- Min: 1
- Max: 102

# **MOI Results**

## • High Demand

- 1,118 tenants applied

## Good Acceptance Rate

- 652 tenants were accepted (58%)

## Low Moving On Rate

- 209 moved on (19%)


## Disproportionate Participation

Top 20% had most (55%) of the applications & most (52%) of the successful placements

## **Reasons for Non-Placement**

- **189 Rejected**
- **216** In process at time initiative ended
  - 61 Certified but never received voucher
- **<u>443</u>** Received voucher but didn't move
- **909 Total Non-Placements**

# Other Barriers to Successful Move Out

- Lack of housing placement resources
- Landlord reluctance
- Lack of accessible apartments
- Tenant opting not to move
  - Housing options less attractive
  - Concern over losing services
  - Concern over losing community
