


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


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

Danny and Annie Perasa remember their first date.

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
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“I remember going to REI and looking at tents that will hold a family of five.”

Van Harris and his wife Shirley remember their old Brooklyn neighborhood and the characters who congregated at Dubrow's Cafeteria on Eastern Parkway.






“I turned on all the tricks that I knew...”

96-year-old Anna Wise remembers dating her husband in an interview with her daughter, Mary.





Navy veteran Victoria Lord reflects on how the military positively impacted her life.



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




“What I have to do is concentrate on my future, on the present, on anything I can possibly do to make my life better...”
