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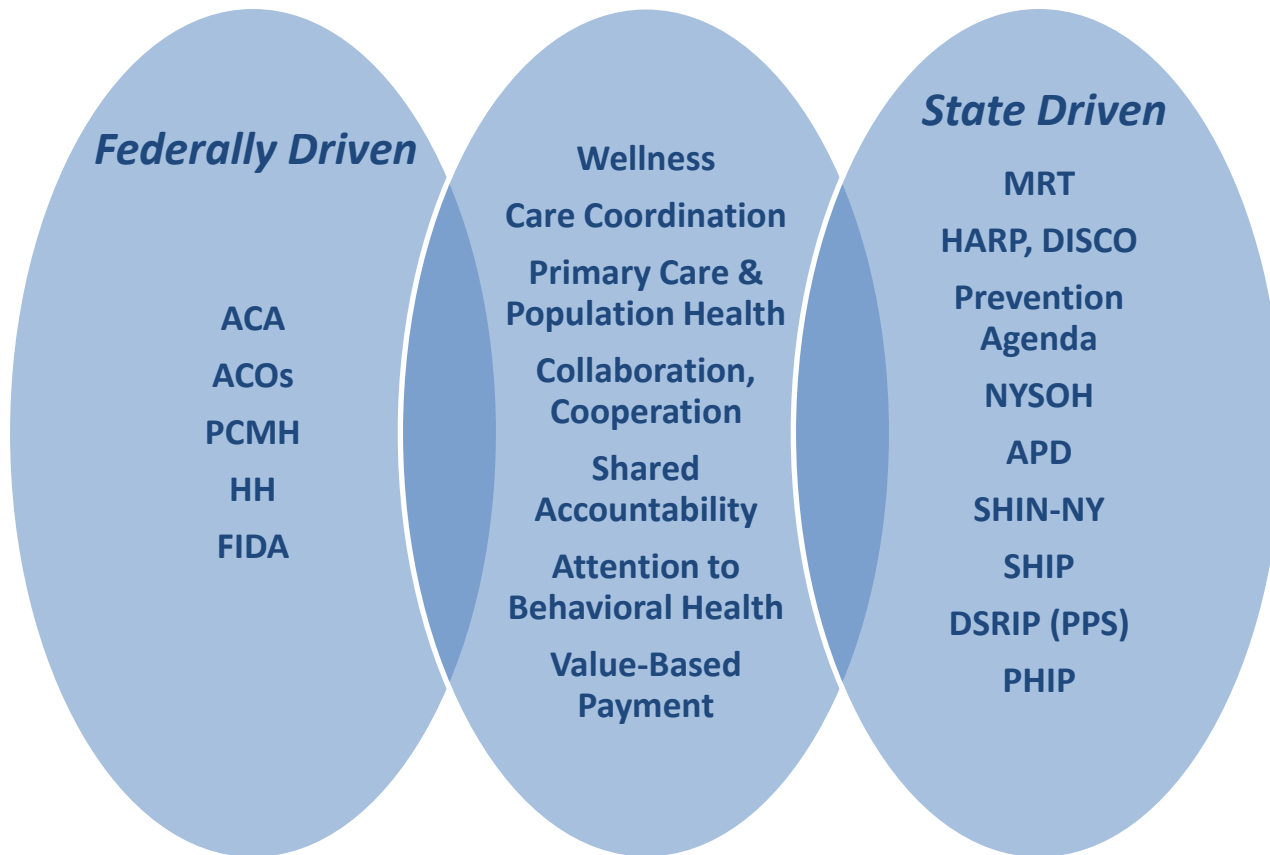

# DOH - MRT Allocation Plan

- The MRT Allocation Plan increases funding for Supportive Housing in 2015-16 and 2016-17 by \$26,767,580.
- The funding provides for increases to: Capital (\$6M), Rental Subsidies/Supportive Services (\$4M), New Supportive Housing Pilot Programs (\$15M) and Tracking and Evaluation (\$1M).

# DOH - DSRIP & Supportive Housing

- The final MRT allocation plan includes \$4.5 million for the Department of Health to create a DSRIP rental subsidy program to assist PPS leads to develop supportive housing programs with providers in their network. This program is currently under development and the Department will hold several work group meetings with the stakeholder community this summer to gather feedback on how best to structure the program.
- The Finger Lakes PPS included Transitional Supportive Housing in their DSRIP application. Here's their project objective:

Participating hospitals will partner with community housing providers and home care service organizations to develop transitional supportive housing for high-risk patients who, due to their medical or behavioral health conditions, have difficulty transitioning safely from a hospital into the community.



# Office of Alcohol and Substance Abuse Services (OASAS)

The current OASAS housing portfolio has a total of 1,908 apartment units in 32 Counties of NYS, which includes the 5 Boroughs of NYC.

In fiscal year 2015-2016 under the NY/NY III homeless agreement OASAS will release a RFP to award an additional 80 units of housing targeting homeless families in New York City.

OASAS oversees and administers a housing portfolio that is funded at approximately \$30 million with six distinct brands of permanent supportive housing (PSH):

1. Shelter Plus Care;
2. NY NY III Singles;
3. NY NY III Families;
4. Re-entry;
5. Upstate Permanent Supportive Housing; and
6. MRT Housing.



# Office of People with Developmental Disabilities (OPWDD)

- OPWDD is transforming its system to help people with intellectual and developmental disabilities have greater control over their lives and receive supports that are based on their individual needs. *Moving Housing Forward* is a major part of this transformation
- OPWDDs focus had been on investing in property and has now shifted to a focus based on the following elements:
  - Living arrangements that are typical for people without disabilities;
  - Housing options that are not dependent on agency investment in property;
  - Disconnecting housing from services;
  - Housing gives a person the opportunity to choose with whom to live;
  - Housing options that allow a person to take command of his/her life and build durable relationships with other individuals, including family, paid staff, neighbors, and friends;
  - Services that are flexible, can change over time and not automatically include supervision.



# Office of Mental Health (OMH)

- OMH has over 40,000 units of housing for adults and children and expects to increase this by over 8,000 units in the near future.
  - Approximately 800 of these units are targeted for NYNY III which are being built in collaboration with sister agencies (state and city level).
