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Housing and OASAS

What is OASAS:

- Certify and authorize over 1,300 treatment and prevention programs.
- Operate 12 Inpatient Addiction Treatment Centers
- Treat more than 240,000 New Yorkers on an annual basis.
- Fund more than 1,100 treatment and prevention programs which serve all who seek their help.
- Fund more than 1,900 housing units statewide.

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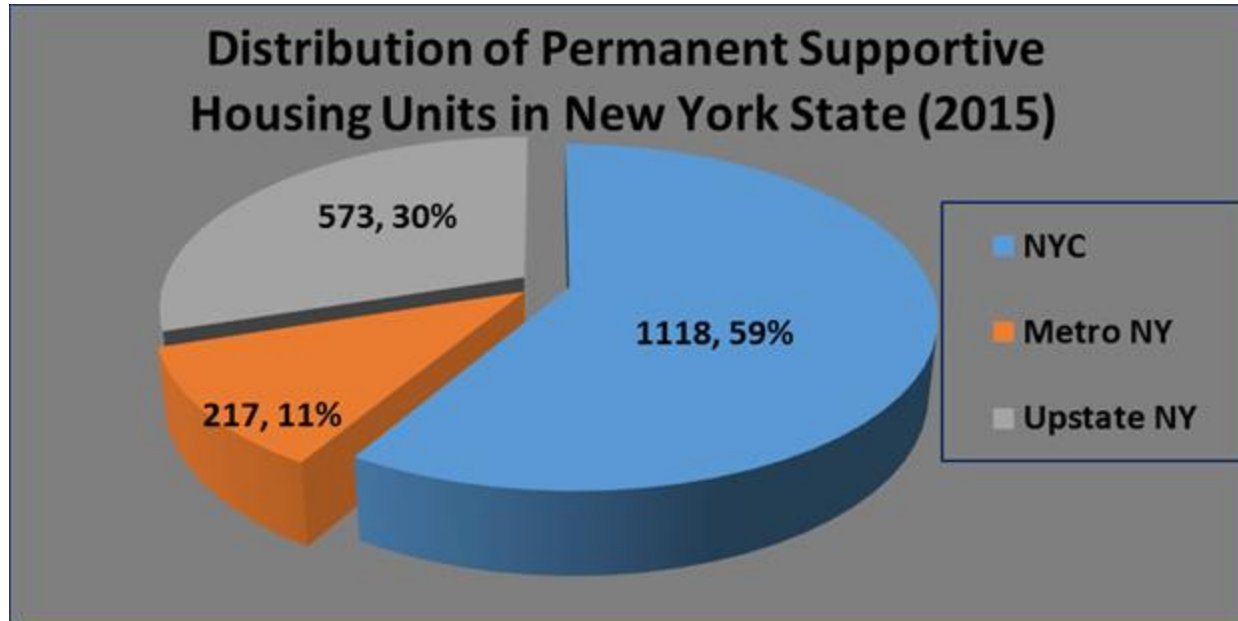
Housing and OASAS

- Three pronged approach:
 - Expand Housing Portfolio
 - Residential Redesign
 - Opportunities to create new residential treatment



Expand Portfolio

- **Coming Soon** - New RFP for 80 units – NY/NY III



Residential Redesign

- OASAS is redesigning our residential system to better meet patient needs.
- Three elements:
 - **Stabilization** - Individual will receive medically-directed care to treat acute problems and adjust to early recovery.
 - **Rehabilitation** - Individual will learn to manage recovery within the safety of the program.
 - **Community Re-integration** - Individual will further develop recovery skills and begin to re-integrate into the community.



Opportunities

Three-Quarter Houses/Sober Homes:

- Narco Freedom case –
 - Create new residential treatment



Medicaid Managed Care

- Stable reimbursement (APGs) for 2 years
- Clinic to Rehab – services provided outside of the clinics
- Network Protections – must be in provider networks
- Residential Redesign – beds to meet all needs
- No Prior Authorization for outpatient services (OP, IOS, OPR and OTP)
- No "All Products Clauses"
- LOCATDR 3.0 - mandatory for MMC
- Court Mandates = medical necessity
