Dear Provider of Supportive Housing Services,

The New York City Department of Health and Mental Hygiene is pleased to announce that Centers for Urgent Care, an urgent care network with locations in Brooklyn and Queens, will continue to host COVID-19 vaccine clinics. These clinics will offer COVID-19 vaccines to residents of congregate supportive housing programs, residents of scattered site supportive housing programs that meet eligibility criteria, as well as staff and residents that are part of the I/DD community. <https://www1.nyc.gov/site/doh/covid/covid-19-vaccine-eligibility.page>. All staff who have direct contact with tenants in both congregate and scattered site programs are eligible. Clinics will continue to be held weekdays.

To pre-register for a block of appointments for your residents and staff, visit <https://registration.cucvaccinations.com/>. Additional registration information below. **Please note this is pre-registration only and confirmation will depend on vaccine supply.** Centers for Urgent Care will contact you to confirm appointments.

Prior to the appointment, each person scheduled to receive the COVID-19 vaccine must complete and bring to their appointment a [COVID-19 Immunization Screening and Consent Form](#). On the day of appointment, they must complete a [New York State COVID-19 Vaccine Form](#). In addition, individuals who are eligible must provide proof of employment in New York, such as an employee ID card, a letter from their employer or affiliated organization, or a recent pay stub (depending on specific priority status). Residents should bring proof of congregate resident status (a letter from the housing program).

For people 65 or older who cannot take public transportation and have no other way to get to the appointment, the following options are available:

- If the person has access to Access-A-Ride, they can make a reservation [online](#) or by calling 877-337-2017.
- If the person has Medicaid-provided transportation, they can use their usual contact number to schedule transport or they can call 844-666-6270.
- If the person is homebound or needs an ambulette, they (or staff) can schedule

free transport with Hunter Ambulettes by calling 718-991-2211

- People who do not qualify for the options above can schedule a free taxi ride with Curb by calling 646-349-0289.
